- Will work towards a qualification
- Earn a wage
- Get holiday pay
- Develop job-specific skills
- Work with experienced staff
- Be allocated time to study

Did you know?

The current minimum wage rate for an apprentice is £3.70 per hour.

This rate applies to apprentices under 19 and those aged 19 or over who are in their first year.
